





ARCHIVAL ANECDOTES

Notable Florence First Presbyterians

John Jackson Mitchell





John Jackson Mitchell, the son of Dr. W.H. Mitchell and Martha Jackson Mitchell of the Forks of Cypress, was a Florence native. He graduated from The University of Mississippi and received a law degree from Cumberland University in Lebanon, Tennessee. After graduating he returned home and bought The Florence Gazette from James Irvine. For a time, he was publisher and editor of the newspaper. He then entered politics; served in the state legislature, and was appointed Probate Judge, a position he held for two terms. In 1904 Judge Mitchell ended his political career and devoted his life to the First Presbyterian Church and to the Associated Charities of Florence. The Exchange Club listed him in their Book of Golden Deeds. He served on the Eliza Coffee Memorial Hospital board for many years along with his friend and associate, Dr. D.W. Hollingsworth. Because of their years of service, the ECM annex was named for them - The Mitchell-Hollingsworth Annex.

Judge Mitchell was a large landowner. Among his holdings was a stretch of land from the UNA campus to Lelia Street. Here he created the first subdivision in Florence. He and his family lived nearby at 450 Wood Avenue. This lovely house has remained in the Mitchell family for several generations. Today it is the home of his great grandson, Uhland Redd III and his wife, Josephine, who are devoted members of our First Presbyterian Church congregation.

Judge and Mrs. Mitchell are buried in the Jackson Cemetery at the Forks of Cypress.
