

#### A Letter from Tammy

Happy New Year! I am so excited to see what this year brings to our church, and to our Downtown Youth Ministry. I want to explain a few things that might help you to understand me, and my ministry better. I know this is a bit confusing, but I also know that God is at work.

First of all, I am married! To a wonderful man named Scotty. He lives in Nacogdoches, Texas with our youngest

son, Levi (who is a senior in high school). Scotty and I have ministered for over 20 years with college students at Stephen F. Austin State University (SFA), and he is continuing that ministry. Please be aware that part of my discussion with the hiring committee was that I would need to travel back to Texas once a month to see my family. (Just so you know it was planned... and this is not a sign that I am changing my mind or regretting being here.)

I have three other children. Hazel teaches kindergarten in Nacogdoches, and is married to Mickey Clark, who is finishing up at SFA this year. Hannah has recently begun teaching at an elementary school in Houston. She is a reading interventionist. William is in the Navy, and lives in Norfolk, Virginia. My boys are adopted, and therefore have a different last name (Haynes).

My job here is a new concept called a co-op. The idea is that two (or more) churches can pool their resources to provide a higher quality service for the group involved. I am very excited about this idea... of setting aside our differences to better serve (in this case) our youth.

I know some of my ideas are new and maybe strange to you... I am aware! I am also very thankful that you are loving me anyway. I appreciate your patience as I learn about Presbyterian traditions and the ins and outs of committees. This is all new to me. So, please forgive me when I mess up or step over lines that I don't know are there. I promise that I want to be mindful of all the things!

I would like to explain one area where my ideas may be different than what you are used to... I have the difficult and exciting opportunity to mesh two whole church's youth. In my opinion, the students need to know and feel comfortable with both congregations in order to do this. So, I have purposely tried to bring members together for social events in order to show we are all actually supporting this endeavor. And you guys have been so supportive! Thank you!

These next few months I will be settling into my rhythm. I will continue to try to get to know the students, families, and the members of each church. I will continue having the whole group together at least once a week (Sunday Night Live). I will continue to be available to visit with students and members whenever possible. I am committed to your youth. And I am having a blast getting to know them.

Here is how you can help:

\*Host our group in your home or other venue for a Sunday Night Live. This is an easy

way to connect with our students. If you are at all interested, just give me a call, text, or email... and I will answer any questions you may have.

- \*Get to know me, and our students. I have posted office hours, Monday and Tuesday mornings and afternoons. My afternoons are spent in Rivertown Coffee Shop for those who would like that more relaxed atmosphere. In addition, I am certainly available at other times to meet, talk, etc. All you have to do is contact me!
- \*Talk to me. If you have an idea or a criticism... PLEASE talk to me. I am willing to hear you out. I am aware that your ideas can bless our students! Don't hesitate to ask my reasoning, or to share your own.
- \*Finally, please add me and our ministry to your daily prayer list. I treasure your prayers! For me, for our students, for our group as a whole, and for our two churches.

For now, just let me say Thank You. Thank you for introducing yourself to me (over and over), Thank you for trusting me with your youth. Thank you for showing up to eat with each other and folks from Trinity at Friendsgiving. Thank you for watching a silly movie with us at the Shoals Theater.

<u>Duties</u>: Set up and operate sound equipment. • Create and share links to live streamed services. • Perform proper line check. • Perform proper sound check; includes gain settings, monitor mixes, proper volume settings, and eq/mixing process. Monitor sound feels to ensure quality. • Test and resolve equipment issues. • Diagnose and correct media system problems. • Check with pastor for worship schedule and any schedule changes. During Service • Responsible for adjusting sound levels during service as needed. • Responsible for following pastor's direction and musician's direction during services. • Responsible for recording and live streaming the service including switching between multiple cameras to capture the minister, choir, speaker, or congregation as appropriate. • Responsible for following stage and schedule cues. • Responsible for providing a distraction-free service as it relates to audio production. • Determine and execute filming sequences and camera movements.

I realize that planning for our nights hosting HFH has seemed very "hurry up and wait" and am sorry for that frustration. We will have at least one more meeting between now and February 1st to make certain we are best prepared to host our unsheltered neighbors.

Shortly into the New Year, I will send out an email(s) to get us started with building the Host Teams for each of our 3 shelter nights.

Dear Friends,

We want to express our deepest gratitude to everyone who has supported our mission - whether through donations of supplies, food, funds, or by dedicating your time and energy. This work is deeply personal to us, and we are deeply passionate about what we do.

Before our last winter shelter season ended, we set a goal to expand beyond winter sheltering and provide year-round support to better serve our unhoused neighbors. Since then, we've made significant strides. Through initiatives like street outreach, warm meal deliveries, laundry vouchers, hydration stations, and our summer Cool Down program, we've been able to walk alongside individuals in need. These efforts have helped people secure jobs and housing, access medical care, begin recovery from substance abuse and so much more. Witnessing these transformations and milestones has been one of the most rewarding experiences of our lives.

But it has also been the most challenging. We have poured everything - our time, energy, finances, and well-being - into this mission, often at the expense of our family and our mental and physical health. While our hearts urge us to keep moving forward, our minds and bodies are telling us to pause.

Our children have shared in our passion for helping others, and they are proud of the impact we've made. But they have also felt the effects of reduced family time, financial strain, and the stress that comes with this work. For their sake, we must acknowledge the toll this is taking.

As of now, our plan is to discontinue - or at the very least, significantly scale back - our operations at the end of this Winter Shelter season. Without a dramatic increase in funding and dedicated volunteer support, Home Free Haven cannot continue as it is.

To help us focus on what's most critical, we are no longer accepting supply donations until further notice. Our limited storage space, time, and manpower make it impossible to manage the volume of items we have received - many of which are stained, torn, broken, or simply not useful for the people we serve. While we appreciate the intent behind these donations, sorting through unsuitable donations has taken time and energy away from our mission. We are committed to treating the individuals we serve with dignity, and we hope others will honor that commitment moving forward if we decide to accept supply donations in the future.

Additionally, we kindly ask for your patience when reaching out to us. We receive an average of 30 calls, texts, emails, and messages per day. It is simply not possible for us to answer every call or respond to every message immediately. If you choose not to leave a voicemail, your call will not be returned. Managing communication alongside the daily tasks of this mission is challenging, and we appreciate your understanding as we prioritize our time and resources. Looking ahead at the weather forecast, we plan to operate on our regular Thursday - Sunday schedule.

While we remain hopeful for Home Free Haven's future, we feel it's important to be honest about where we are now. We need more funding and a core group of dedicated volunteers to sustain and grow this mission. We ask for your prayers, your positive energy, and most importantly, your continued love for your neighbor - today and every day.

Thank you for standing by us and believing in this mission. We hope to continue serving beyond March 15th, but this is where things stand for now. Please be patient as we navigate these challenges, and know that every effort we make is for the individuals who depend on us and the community we love.
